Admissions Guidelines:

The University of St. Thomas operates on a rolling admissions basis, meaning applications are reviewed as they are received. The priority deadlines for applying are as follows: August 1 for fall semester and January 1 for spring semester. **Early application will facilitate your registration for classes at UST.**

St. Thomas will **consider** applications from students who have attained a grade-point average of at least 2.3 in transferable baccalaureate-level courses. Students are notified of acceptance within approximately three weeks of completing their application.

Notes:

Students will be required to fulfill general education requirements as published in the catalog of the year they enroll at the University of St. Thomas.

St. Thomas requires 84 semester credits outside the major department, and 132 semester credits total for graduation. Students must complete 32 of their last 36 credits at St. Thomas, as stated in the Senior Residency Requirement.

Recognition Scholarship Program:

Sponsored by St. Thomas, this competitive scholarship is awarded to top students who have earned at least 56 semester credits or the quarter credit equivalent at a community college and have a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher. A total of six \$4,000 Recognition Scholarships will be awarded annually to new transfer students.
