



The AA degree is primarily intended for students who plan to transfer and complete a bachelor’s degree. This is a generic example course sequence. Students must make a specific plan based on their particular field of study/major and the 4-year college or university to which they plan on transferring. See a counselor to develop an appropriate general education and pre-major course plan for your individual goals as soon as possible. Also consult with representatives from your transfer college for detailed transfer admissions and college major requirements information.
